

# WESTEIERMARK MATCHING

Blauer Wildbacher grows almost exclusively in this area. It will thrive in the warm summers with cooling influences coming from the north. Wildbacher is also made into red, sweet or sekt(sparkling) in the region as well. Schilcher rose has its own origin designation in Westeiermark.
