WINE STYLES

Dry wines of pale ruby colour, turning to pale garnet within 3–5 years, with high level of tannins. Recently, the tip of the bunch is harvested early to make classic method sparkling wines.

WESTEIERMARK MATCHING

Nebbiolo is a variety that doesn't adapt easily to other areas. The soils on which Nebbiolo usually grows are a mixture of sand, clay and limestone whereas Weststeiermark soils are made of gneiss and mica schist. It would be interesting to try to plant Nebbiolo on the steeper hills in the area near Eibiswald that is more limestone than gneiss.
